HOW WONDERFUL? (Part 2)

A couple of weeks ago, I read an article online about one its cast members, a lady named Karolyn Grimes, who played George and Mary's young daughter Zuzu.¹ She was the little girl who was sick when George had his meltdown; in one of the tenderest scenes in the movie, she hands him a flower that has lost two of its petals and asks him to fix it. He can't, of course; he simply conceals the petals in his pocket, hands her back the flower, and tells her that it is fine. Even though the movie was made in 1946, Karolyn Grimes didn't see it until 1979, when she was 39, working full time and trying to raise seven children. She caught it out of the corner of her eye when it was on TV and suddenly realized: "I was in that movie. I was Zuzu." She hadn't seen it when she was small because her mother hadn't allowed it; she was worried that watching it would make her little girl "prideful." Only after the copyright expired in 1974 did the movie become widely available, and local television stations used it as a free source of programming.

Karolyn Grimes' life had consisted of one trial after another. When she was 12, her mother died of early-onset Alzheimer's. When she was 15, her father died in a car crash. The court sent her to live with an aunt and uncle in Missouri, who, she said, didn't believe in movies, dancing, singing, acting "or laughter." They cut off all connections with her friends in California. With the help of her high school teachers, she was able to go to college and became a medical tech at a clinic near Kansas City. She wed, had two daughters, and then divorced. Soon after the divorce, her daughters' father was killed in a hunting accident. She remarried, had another son and daughter, and helped raise her husband's three children from a previous marriage. And then her 18 year old son committed suicide, her husband died of cancer, and she retired to take care of her teenage daughters, two of whom became single parents.

"My life has never been wonderful," she told Raymond Lane, a writer for *The Washington Post*. "Maybe when I was a child, but not after age 15. And maybe that's what makes the film so important for me and a lot other people. George is suffering terribly in the movie...you can just see it. He's in Martini's Café and saying to himself, 'God, I'm not a praying man, but please show me the way'...it's about how we have to face life with a lot of uncertainty, and even though nobody hears it, most of us ask God to show us the way when things get really hard...Everybody has some sorrow, worry, and everybody asks God for help. One way or the other, we all do, and it can be in Martini's, not a church on Christmas." And that was what Karolyn Grimes—little Zuzu all grown up—did after she first saw the movie she had made so long before. She asked God for help.

It's the strangest thing. Soon after her first encounter with the movie she had made 33 years before, Karolyn Grimes began to receive fan mail. Soon after that, she began to receive invitations to appear at showings of the film. Since 1994, she has been making a living from the movie, with appearances, memorabilia sales, and even an *It's a Wonderful Life* cookbook. It's not a coincidence that answered prayer is the great spiritual theme of the movie. How many ways are there to God? As many as there are people. If an old movie is

one of the means God uses, glory be to God.

God has a plan and a purpose for every one of us, even if it takes years, or even decades, for us to find our way, and our most consequential prayers are usually the most desperate ones, the ones where we beg God to show us the way. When the angel first appeared to Mary, he didn't tell her she would have a wonderful life—he told her that she was favored by God, and that God had chosen her to bring the Savior into the world. Being Jesus' mother led to her heart being pierced again and again; but she *was* favored by God, and out of her love and sense of duty (because duty and love are intimately connected), she became an infinite blessing to the world. Whenever we feel that we are at the end of our ropes and cannot go on, remember that if you are loved by someone, you have the universe. And we *are* loved; Jesus Christ came into the world out of love for us. As Clarence wrote George, "No man is a failure who has friends."

Our most devoted friend is Jesus.

Brett Briefly...

A CHRISTMAS TEST – THE ANSWERS

In last week's edition of *The Challenger*, I offered 12 questions to test your knowledge of the Biblical account of Jesus' birth. Today, I am printing the answers to the questions, along with some explanation if I feel it is warranted. I hope you took the opportunity to read the birth narratives in both Matthew and Luke. May the gift of the Messiah be the gift that guides all our giving this Christmas.

1. How did Mary and Joseph travel to Bethlehem? The Bible doesn't say.
2. What did the innkeeper tell Mary and Joseph? There is no word in the Bible about the innkeeper. The innkeeper is actually not a character mentioned in the Bible at all. See Luke 2:7.
3. Jesus was delivered in a _____. Again, the Bible does not say exactly where Jesus was delivered. Luke 2:7 tells us that Jesus was laid in a manger after he had been born and properly wrapped, but no word on where the actual birth took place.
4. A manger is a _____. A manger is a feeding trough used cattle, sheep, donkeys, or horses. They were made of stone or masonry and measured approximately 3 feet long, 18 inches wide, and 2 feet deep. Mangers were present in cave stables, and also in houses. Many homes consisted of one large room with an elevated section and a lowered section. The elevated section was the family's living quarters, while the lowered section housed the family's animals. Typically a manger would be located in this lower section.
5. Which animals does the Bible say were present at Jesus' birth? The Bible does not mention any animals present at the birth of Jesus.
6. How many angels spoke to the shepherds? One. See Luke 2:9-12. The multitude of angels never spoke directly to the shepherds. Rather, they spoke praise to God.
7. What is a "heavenly host?" The word "host" is a military term, and literally means army.
8. What is frankincense? A precious perfume. In addition to being given to Jesus as a child, frankincense was also used in the most holy place in the tabernacle. See Exodus 30:34.
9. What is myrrh? A spice used for burying people. In addition to being given to Jesus as a child, myrrh was also used to hastily embalm Jesus after his death. See John 19:39.
10. How many wise men came to see Jesus? The Bible does not specify how many wise men, or magi, came to see Jesus. Three gifts are mentioned, but not the number of magi bearing those gifts.
11. The wise men found Jesus in a _____. House. When the wise men reported to King Herod, they told him the star had appeared as much as two years earlier. Jesus, by the time the magi reached Bethlehem, was very likely a toddler.
12. What does "wise men" refer to? The wise men were eastern astrologers. The magi that greeted Jesus were likely from Babylon, Persia, or the Arabian Desert. The biblical account does not give them names, number, or royal position. It was Tertullian who first called them kings before AD 225.

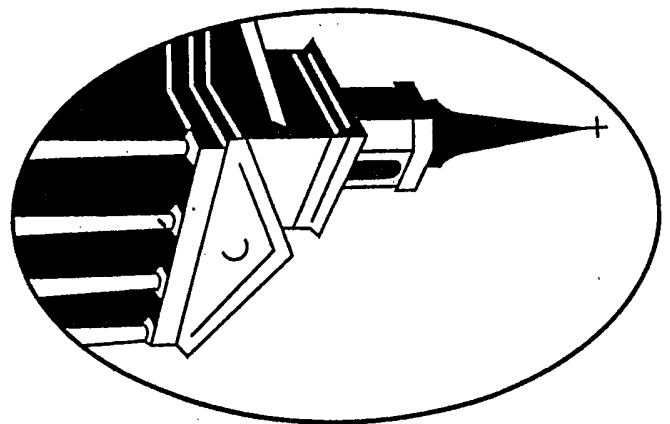
